## Vocational, Associate Degree, and Trade-School Students

## **Blair and Mike Pirrello Vocational Scholarship**

Founded by Blair and Mike and their family

Criteria: Recipient must be a Loudoun County resident and high-school graduate or GED equivalent within the past four years preceding application seeking further education through a vocational trade or apprenticeship. Some emphasis may be placed on financial need. With approval funds received may be used for academic or testing costs, books, and associated trade tools.

Est. Scholarship: \$500-\$2,500

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS: Completed Community Foundation universal application form; one-page essay sharing "Why trade or vocational school is a good fit for me," or, "My plans for the future." FAFSA/1040 required.

#### Val and Bill Tillett Scholarship

Founded by Bill and Val Tillett

Criteria: Recipient must be attending Northern Virginia Community College seeking a degree within the school's Horticulture program. Award priority includes Loudoun County residence as well as financial need; residents of Prince William, Fairfax, Alexandria, and Arlington will be considered. Both full-time and part-time applicants may apply. Once selected, an applicant may apply for a second consecutive year of scholarship support with re-application and at least a 2.5 GPA or C+ or higher.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS: Completed Community Foundation universal application form; 250-words essay sharing "Why a degree in Horticulture Technology or Landscape Design Specialization is a good fit for me," or, "My financial challenges to attend school;" letter of recommendation from the Program Head or teacher in the NOVA Community College's Horticulture program; FAFSA/1040, and grade transcripts required.

# **Graduating High School Seniors and Second-Year Plus Students**

## **Debbie Settle Scholarship Foundation**

Founded by the family and friends of Debbie Settle

Criteria: Recipient must be a graduate or graduating from a Loudoun County high school\_within the last six months with at least a <u>3.0 GPA</u>; indicate an intent to study and undertake a <u>future</u> <u>career in music performance or music education</u>, with some emphasis on recipients seeking to



pursue choral leadership, such as but not limited to, choral directing, choral education, and choral performance. Once selected, applicants may apply for a renewed scholarship if maintaining the course of study and 2.8 GPA or higher.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS: Completed Community Foundation universal application form; FAFSA/1040, SAT/ACT scores, letter of recommendation, grade transcripts required and 250-300-word essay sharing "how you seek to inspire others through a career in music."

#### Gavin Rupp "I Promise 15" Scholarship

Founded by the friends and family of Gavin Rupp

Criteria: Recipient must have at least a 3.0 GPA (B Average) as (a) a graduate or graduating from a high school in Loudoun County (within last 12 months) or (b) a post-graduate pursuing a degree. Areas of study shall be dedicated to a career interest in allied health medicine with selection preference; post-graduate requirements for students studying pediatric cancer treatment (oncology). Past year recipients pursuing undergraduate degrees may apply for a renewed scholarship; post-graduate student awards are not renewable.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS: Completed Community Foundation universal application form; 250-300- word essay sharing why you seek to be a healthcare professional; For FAFSA/1040, SAT/ACT scores (high school grads), letter of recommendation; and grade transcripts required.

#### **Quinn William Gorman Scholarship**

Founded by the family and friends of Quinn Gorman

Criteria: Recipient must be a Loudoun-county resident and a graduate or graduating from a <u>Loudoun County high school with an emphasis on Riverside High School</u> with at least a <u>3.4 GPA</u> with some emphasis on financial need as well community involvement, events and/or sports, and intent to achieve a four-year degree.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS: Completed Community Foundation universal application form; FAFSA/1040, SAT/ACT scores, letter of recommendation, grade transcripts required and 250-300-word essay sharing "Your goals and why you wish to attend higher education."

#### **Stowers Loudoun County High School Scholarship**

Founded by Henry C. Stowers

Criteria: Recipient must be a graduate from <u>Loudoun County High School</u>, <u>Leesburg</u>, <u>VA</u>, <u>Loudoun County</u> (within last 6 months); offer evidence of financial need, scholastic ability, and participation in school and community activities. One awardee will be selected each year; the award is renewable for a total of four years with annual application.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS: Completed Community Foundation universal application form; FAFSA/1040, SAT/ACT scores, letter of recommendation, and grade transcripts required.



# **Loudoun Nonprofit Staff/Volunteer Students**

### Mary B. Tett Healthcare Professionals Scholarship

Founded by the family of the late Mary B. Tett

Criteria: The Mary B. Tett Healthcare Professionals Fund is intended as a scholarship to benefit current volunteers and/or current staff of any healthcare nonprofit organization in Loudoun County, Virginia, pursuing continuing education, certification, or degrees such as but not limited to nursing, pre-med, medical records, behavioral health, and physician's assistant. For those pursuing a two- or four-year degree, applicants should maintain a 3.0 GPA. Past recipients may reapply for renewed scholarship funding.

Est. Scholarship: \$1,000

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS: Completed general application form; two- or four-year degree students should include grade transcripts; a letter of recommendation from the nonprofit organization for which you volunteer or work.
