

PRESENT PERFECT TENSE

Present perfect tense describes something that happened some unspecified time before now or that started before but has continued until now.

Uses

- 1. For an unspecified time before now
- 2. To express a change over time
- 3. To express an accomplishment
- 4. For an uncompleted action you are expecting
- 5. To express multiple actions at different times
- 6. Duration from past until now



Examples

- 1. I have seen something like it before.
- 2. My writing has really improved since I took the essay course.
- 3. Her daughter has earned a diploma.
- 4. Jane has not achieved her goal yet.
- 5. My brother **has cleaned** his apartment three times.
- 6. I have loved reading since I was five years old.

Formula

has/have + past participle*

*past participle = verb + -ed when the verb is regular

☑ Checklist

- → Are you describing something that has happened already, but at an unspecified time, or something that is still happening?
- → Have you included the appropriate form of "have" before the main verb?
- → Does your main verb end with an -ed (unless it is irregular)?
