





# How to Enroll a Student in an Honors Class:

- Launch SIS
- ❖ From the Main Menu > Records and Enrollment > Enroll Students > Enrollment Request



- Fill out student's ID, academic career, and term
- Click Add




- Action: Enroll
- Class Nbr: fill in the course's class number
  - Can use the search function to find the section if unsure
- If course has a lab section, also add lab section's course number under "related class 1"
- Check the box for "designation" (should have populated as "LHNR") and check the related box for "take requirement designation"
- Click "save"
  - Make sure no error messages popped up
- Student is now enrolled in the Honors class!
- Collect an Honors Course Permission Form with their qualifier indicated + supporting document attached
  - Email a copy of the completed Honors Course Permission form + supporting documentation to your campus lead faculty for Honors OR Intercampus Mail it to Honors Lead Faculty.


# **How to Add Honors Course Permission\***

\*Useful when the student isn't sure they want to take the class but definitely qualifies


- ❖ Launch SIS
- ❖ From the Main Menu > Records and Enrollment > Term Processing > Class Permissions > Class Permissions




- Fill out Term, Subject Area, Catalog Nbr, Academic Career, and Campus to limit search results, then press Search.
- ❖ The class section data screen will appear, listing the first course that meets your search criteria click on "view all"




❖ Scroll down (or use ctrl-F) to find the correct section



❖ Press the "+" button to add a new row



❖ Add the student's ID to the ID field and press tab. Confirm that the correct name pops up.



- Click on the Permission tab and uncheck the "closed class" and "requisites not met" check boxes
- Scroll down to the bottom of the page and click on "save"
- ❖ The student can now add the course to their shopping cart and check out!
  - Please make it clear to the student that this does not guarantee them a seat in the class – it only allows them to add it at their convenience, and this permission is ONLY applicable for the course and semester for which it is given.
  - For all non-Honors Program students, still collect an Honors Course Permission Form with their qualifier indicated + supporting document attached
    - Email a copy of the completed Honors Course Permission form + supporting documentation to your campus Honors Lead Faculty or intercampus mail.

# Why Take Honors / Join the NOVA Honors Program?

## NOVA Honors "Pitch" from Paul Fitzgerald:

For over 30 years, the NOVA Honors Program has been offering unique opportunities to our brightest students both in the classroom and in the community. However, even after all that time, many folks think that our Honors courses are about "more work," or are just like the regular version, but "harder." Our Honors courses are challenging, as most college classes are! What makes NOVA Honors courses uniquely challenging, however, is that we take the information that is presented in the class, no matter the subject, and turn it into active classroom discussion, practical learning experiences, and real-world analyses of how that material relates to real world situations. In other words, whichever Honors class you take, the class is ultimately about you! Moreover, we keep the class size nice and small, no more than 18 students, just so we can foster that sense of community and encourage that conversational environment. As always with NOVA Honors, you also get the Honors Course designation on your transcript, and it unlocks many networking, workshop, and speaking opportunities that come with being a part of the Honors community.

#### FAQ:

#### Why take an Honors class?

- smaller class sizes with stimulating professors and peers
- student-led discussions in seminar-style classrooms
- multi-disciplinary approaches with a focus on varied information sources and perspectives
- college-wide events and enrichment opportunities

# How is the Honors class different than the regular section?

- Same course content requirements, different ways of learning the information
- REAL components research, enrichment, academic rigor, and leadership, which forms the core of every Honors course

## I took an Honors class, does that mean I am part of the Honors Program?

No. A student can take as many Honors classes as they want without committing to joining the Honors Program. The Honors Program is joined through an application process and commits the student to completion of the Honors Core Curriculum (6 Honors courses spread across disciplines).

#### Why join the Honors Program?

- local, state, regional and national participation in Honors conferences
- competitive edge applying to four-year institutions
- Potential to transfer directly into Honors Programs at select 4-year schools
- Honors course and Core Completion designation on your transcript
- Honors Certificate of Completion for Successful Core Completion

# **How to Join the Honors Program**

# Path 1: Honors Early Entry (NOVA-bound HS Seniors/Homeschooled students)

Qualifications: HS GPA ≥ 3.5, **OR** score at least 1200 out of 1600 with a minimum score of 600 on the SAT Evidence-Based Reading and Writing, and Math sections, **OR** demonstrate an ACT composite score of at least 25



# **NOVA Honors Program Core Requirements**

The Honors Program is distinguished by its Honors Core Curriculum, comprised of specific courses within the categories listed in the following chart. To complete the NOVA Honors Core Curriculum, a student must meet the credit requirements of all categories listed below including the completion of an Honors Interdisciplinary Experience.

# The Honors Interdisciplinary Experience

- The student will complete a supervised, reflective interdisciplinary research paper produced separately from an Honors course; **OR**
- a presentation at Honors symposium or approved Honors conference of which NOVA is a member; or
- at least twenty hours of supervised, verifiable community service; OR
- completion of a credit-bearing internship (3 credits) to be taken to satisfy both 3 credits of Honors Elective AND the Interdisciplinary Experience requirement; OR
- non-credit internship of at least 20+ working hours; OR
- credit-bearing study abroad to be taken in place of an Honors elective; OR
- completion of an Honors Portfolio, which reflects upon or summarizes their Honors experience at NOVA.

Additional specific guidelines may apply for all credit-bearing and non-credit Interdisciplinary Experience opportunities. Please speak with the Honors Lead Faculty member on your campus for more information.

#### **Additional Honors Core Completion Requirements**

- Only courses for which a grade of C or higher was earned may be applied to the Honors Core requirements.
- No more than 9 credits of Honors Option coursework may be applied to the Honors Core requirements.
- The student must maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher to remain in the NOVA Honors Program.
- The student must earn a GPA of 3.275 or higher for Honors Core classes to complete the NOVA Honors Program.

# The NOVA Honors Program Early Admission for NOVA-Bound High School Seniors and Home Schooled Students

The NOVA Honors Program is pleased to announce an early admission process for students who are planning to attend NOVA and wish to be admitted into the NOVA Honors Program as an entering college freshman. Specifically, this opportunity is intended for students who are committed to attending NOVA and completing the credit equivalent of an Associate degree. Any student who meets the criteria listed below may apply.

To be eligible for early admission, you MUST satisfy at least one criterion from each eligibility category.

#### **Current Academic Status**

- ☐ You are currently a senior in good standing at an accredited high school on track to graduate
  with a high school diploma at the end of the Spring term; OR
- ☐ You are home schooled, and eligible to enter NOVA in the upcoming Fall semester.

### **Eligibility**

You possess and are able to verify one of the following qualifying academic criteria:

- ☐ Cumulative GPA (weighted or unweighted) of 3.5 or higher; **OR**
- ☐ Combined SAT totaling 1200 or higher; **OR**
- Combined ACT totaling 25 or higher.

☐ You have completed the NOVA Honors Program Application for Early Admission IN FULL, and you have attached documentation which confirms your eligibility criterion identified above.

The NOVA Honors Program serves as a way for academically talented students to compliment their college experience, by providing a comprehensive, educational opportunities that allow them to interact as a community of learners.
