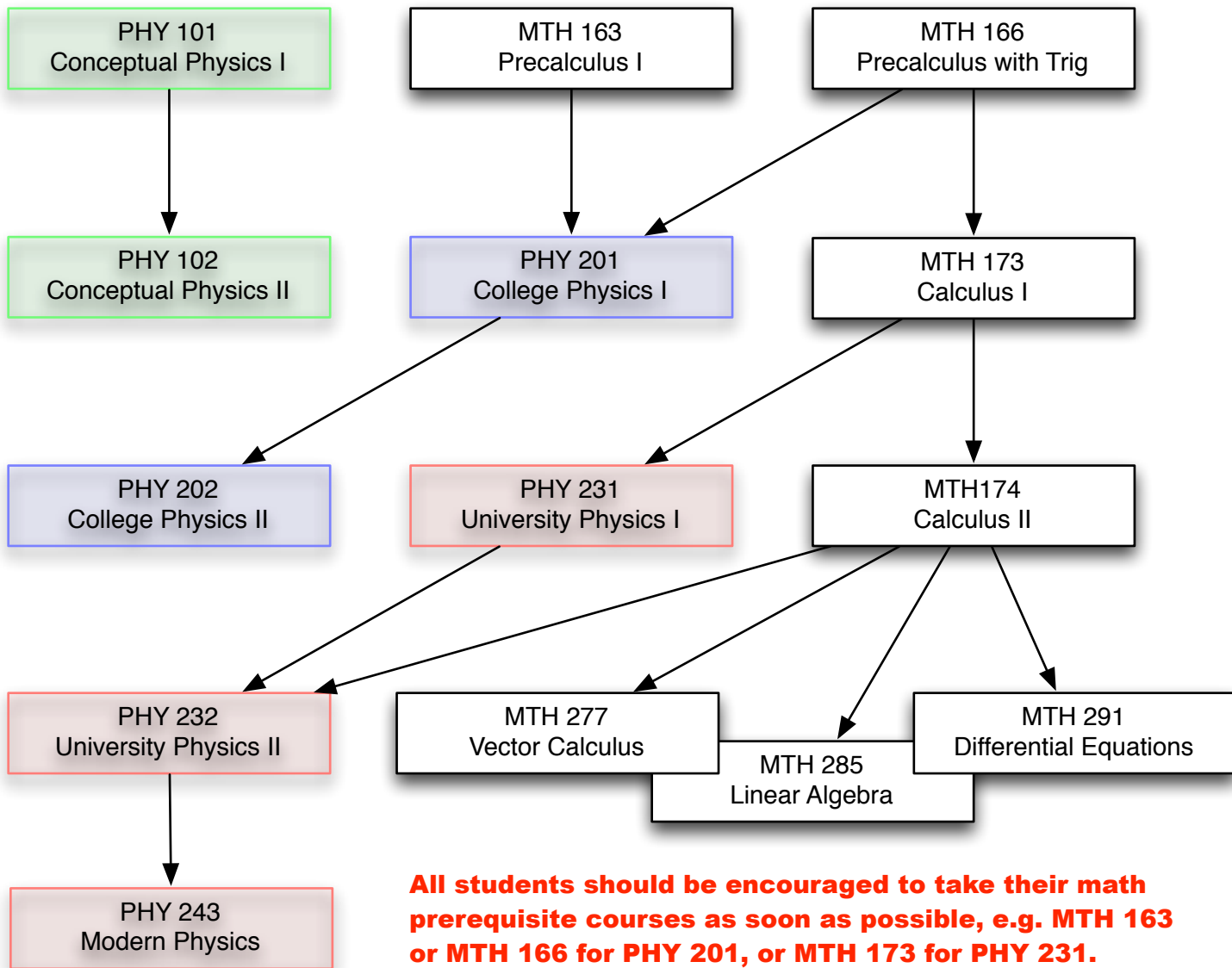


All PHY courses require placement into ENG 111 College Composition I
The remaining PHY and/or MTH prerequisites are as indicated below.



PHY 101-102 sequence for non-science students who are interested in learning the concepts of physics. Students who take it are usually liberal art, business, or any non-science major that requires a science with a lab course as a general elective. While PHY 101-102 has no formal mathematics prerequisites, students are expected to know high-school level of algebra and geometry.

PHY 201-202 sequence is designed as Introductory Physics for the Health Sciences. As such, it is appropriate for most students planning to go to medical school, pharmacy, veterinary, physical therapy, and other health schools. NOTE: some particular schools require 10 credits of physics, and hence those students need to take PHY231-232. Students must check with their intended school whether they are required 8 or 10 credits of Introductory Physics.

PHY 231-232 is designed for students majoring in engineering, physics, mathematics, and chemistry. MTH 173 is a prerequisite for PHY 231. MTH 271 may NOT be used as a substitute for MTH 173. Students are encouraged to take PHY 231 together with MTH174, as both are prerequisites for PHY 232.
