

# Apply for Financial Aid in 3 Easy Steps for 2022-2023!

**STEP ONE:** Create an account (FSA ID) at <https://studentaid.gov/fsa-id/create-account/launch>. If you were born on or after 1/1/1999 and considered a dependent student, your parent must also create an FSA ID using a separate email address. This FSA ID will be used every year to complete and sign your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) for NOVA or any other college.

\*Keep your FSA ID and password safe and secure.

**STEP TWO:** Complete the 2022-2023 FAFSA at <https://studentaid.gov/>. Click: [FAFSA Form](#) > [Complete the FAFSA Form](#).

Include Northern Virginia Community College's School Code on your FAFSA (003727). Allow 3-5 business days for NOVA to receive it.

\*Returning students can renew their FAFSA by choosing the "Log In" option.

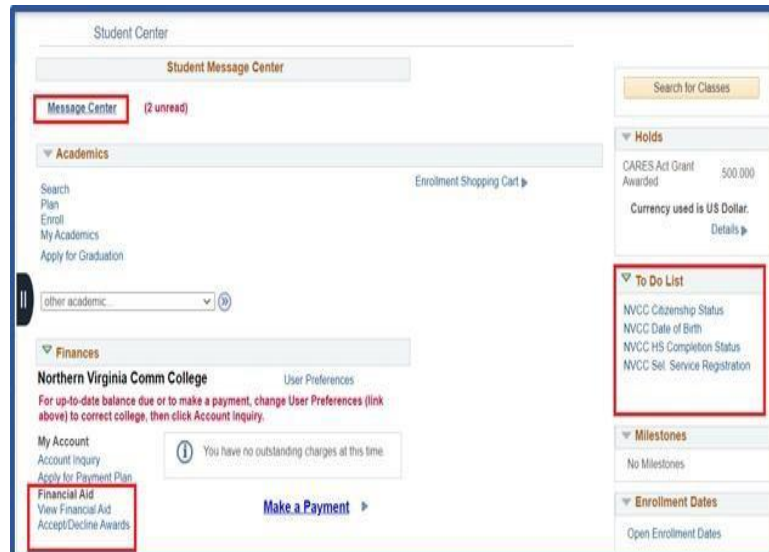
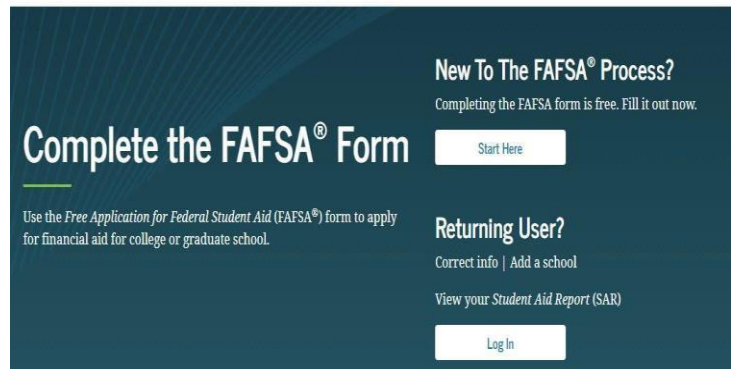
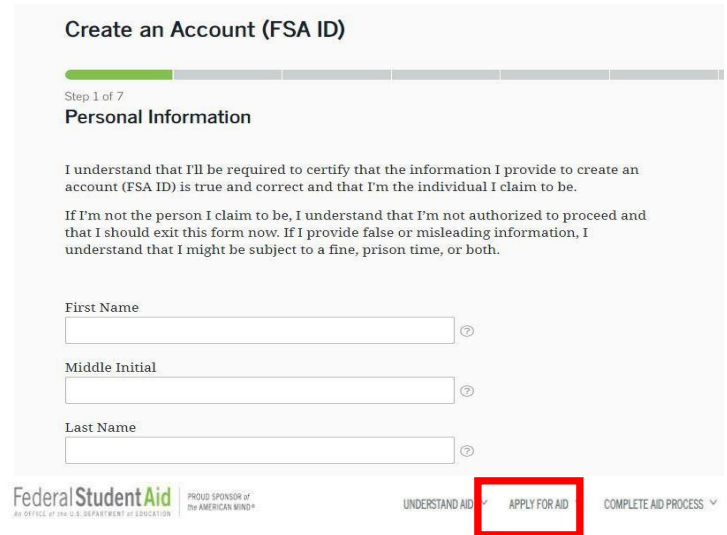
**STEP THREE:** Once your FAFSA is received by NOVA, log into myNOVA at <https://www.nvcc.edu> and check your "[To Do List](#)" in your [Student Center](#) to determine if any additional documentation is required.

Beginning in March for the upcoming academic year, awards are usually offered within two weeks after all documents are received.

\*When NOVA receives your FAFSA an email will be sent to the email address provided on your FAFSA. Please review the email and check your myNOVA [Message Center](#) and [To Do List](#) for any updates.

## What Do I Need to Complete the 2022-2023 FAFSA?

---

There are several items you will need to complete the FAFSA. The 2022-2023 FAFSA covers Fall 2022, Spring 2023, and Summer 2023. For 2022-2023, you will need financial information from 2020. **All students will need the following information to complete the FAFSA application:**

- Your social security number (SSN)
- Your name and date of birth must match your records with the Social Security Administration
- Your 2020 federal tax return (IRS Form 1040 or foreign tax return)
- Your 2020 W-2 forms and other records of money earned in 2020 (if any)
- Your 2020 untaxed income records, if applicable (i.e. child support received, interest income, contributions to retirement accounts, untaxed IRA distributions (excluding rollovers), etc.
- Your current bank statements
- Your current assets (excluding retirement account balances and the home you live in)
- Your alien registration or permanent registration card, if applicable (if you are not a U.S. citizen)
- 2020 federal income tax return and current asset information for your spouse if you are married

**Dependent students**, will also need to provide the following information for their **parent(s)**:

- Parent(s) 2020 federal tax return (IRS Form 1040 or foreign tax return)
- Parent(s) 2020 W-2 forms and other records of money earned in 2020 (if any)
- Parent(s) 2020 untaxed income records, if applicable (i.e. child support received, interest income, contributions to retirement accounts, untaxed IRA distributions (excluding rollovers), etc.
- Parent(s) bank statements
- Parent(s) other current assets (excluding retirement accounts and the home they live in)
- Parent(s) name, SSN, and date of birth that matches the Social Security Administration's records
- Date your parents were married, widowed, divorced or separated

**Note: A dependent student** is a student who does not meet any of the criteria for an independent student. An independent student is defined as someone who is at least one of the following:

*Born before 1/1/1999, married, a graduate or professional student, someone on active duty in the U.S. Armed Forces for purposes other than training, a U.S. Armed Forces veteran, someone who will provide more than 50% of the support for their children or dependents who live with them from 7/1/22 – 6/30/23, someone who was an orphan or a ward of the court or in foster care after turning age 13, an emancipated minor, someone with a court-appointed legal guardian, or someone who is homeless or at risk of becoming homeless. More details are provided on the 2022-2023 FAFSA.*
